#### METHOD STATEMENT FOR GOLD CUP

All measurements in 'ft'.

UNIT SIZE (W x H x L )	2.5 x 3 x 6

#### 1) Arrival on site

- > Find a safe and practical entrance point to unload kit Confirm location is suitable for
- > equipment
- > Confirm where power is available from
- > Ensure ground is flat and free from obstructions
- > Allow a minimum of 2ft (0.6m) clearance around unit

#### 2) The Set Up

- > Use a sackbarrow to move the unit into position, on it's side
- > Fold one set of legs out underneath unit, and carefully lower to floor
- > Lift the other side and fold out legs, then undo clips and remove top section
- > Fold out the material curtain that sits all the way round the unit
- > Plug the kettle lead in to the socket at the rear of the unit
- > Use an extension lead from the nearest power source, and plug kettle lead into it
- > Fold out the white fence post, a few feet in front of the unit
- > Remove the 4 horses and 4 horse cutouts from the underside of the box
- Slide the 4 horse cutouts, matching the numbers on the unit to the Jockey numbers, into each metal coil
- > Place each jockey horse in colour order, onto the white post and plug the phono lead into each socket, and attach the other ends firmly into the horses necks

Switch the unit on, next to the top back left speaker; and the commentary

- > and
  - crowd noise will start
- > Jockey each horse a few times to check the unit works, then turn the unit off and the horses will auto-reverse back to the start line ready for play

#### 3) The Operation

- > This unit is designed for up to 4 players at a time
- > Ensure the players do not bang the horses head on the white fence post
- > No drinks to be placed on the unit at any time

#### 4) The Pack Down

- > Ensure the area is clear of guests before commencing the pack down
- > Turn off power, remove extension lead, and put kettle lead on top of unit
- > Unplug horses, and remove the cutouts, and place all back in the underside of lid Fold the vinyl curtain back up onto the unit, and place white fence post on
- > top
- > Place lid on top, and fasten securely using the butterfly catches
- > Load van in a safe and secure manner, before checking area for equipment
